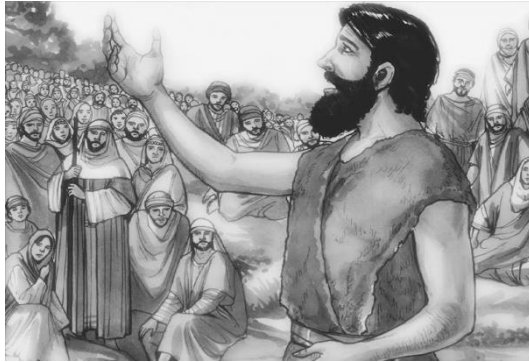

Matthew 21:26 - "But if we say, 'From man,' we are afraid of the crowd ..." Foolish Pharisees! They fear men more than they fear God, and so they miss out on the great blessing of knowing Jesus and His love. All our sins are like this: we fear something more than we fear God. And how foolish that is! Just think of the blessings we miss out on whenever we place our fear or trust in something other than God.

Jesus revealed what was most important to the chief priests and elders. They cared more about their own places of authority than the truth. How different is Jesus! He taught with all authority yet was willing to die for the sake of the truth. He was vindicated and raised again on the third day in order to give forgiveness and life to all who are in Him.

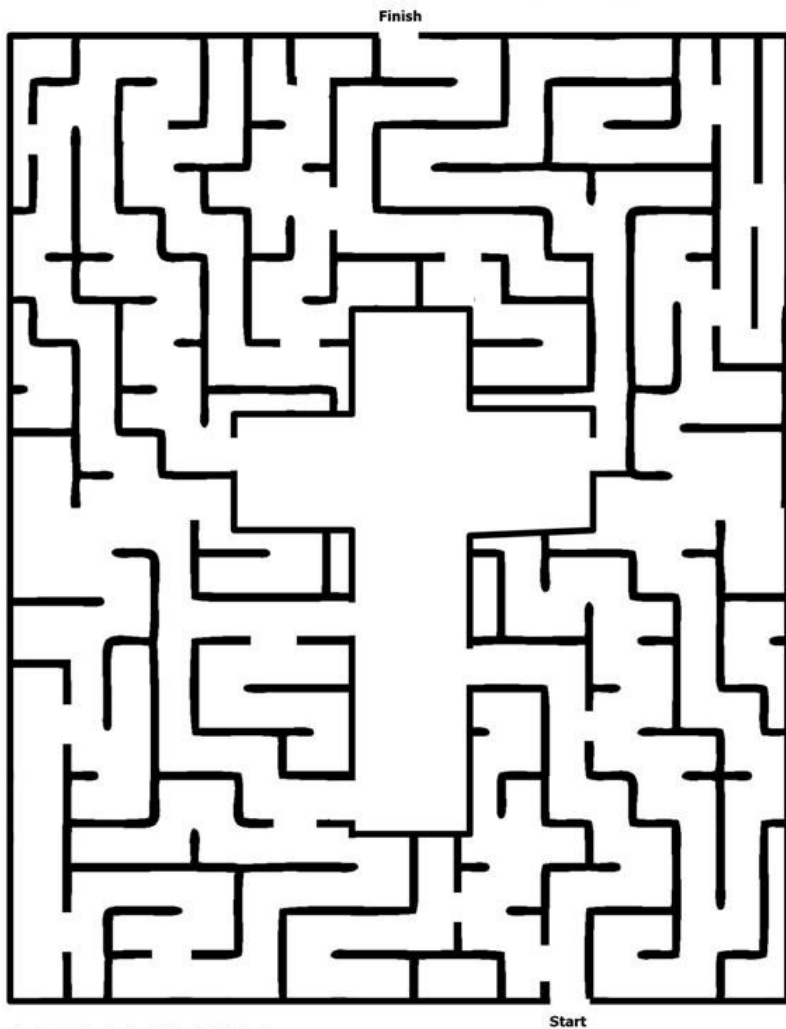
