THE CHILD WHO IS A VIRGIN'S GREAT SON

AS WE GATHER

When Jesus was about to be conceived, Gabriel told Mary, "The child to be born will be called holy" (Luke 1:35). *Holy* means "set apart for a purpose." Centuries before, Samson was one of the judges God set apart to lead His people. His birth was announced to his mother by the angel in words similar to those of Gabriel. Though holy in his calling, Samson had many human failings, as do we, hopeless in our inability to free ourselves from sin. In direct contrast to Samson, Mary's Son, Jesus, "in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin" (Hebrews 4:15). Samson saved God's people from the Philistines, but Jesus saves us from all sin. When Jesus gave His life, He offered us His own holiness. Now, God's Word "You shall be holy, for I am holy" (1 Peter 1:16) applies to us by grace. In every circumstance, we are able to echo Mary's response: "Let it be to me according to your word."

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION


P Gabriel said, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." God has now graciously favored us by giving us faith in the Son born to her. Let us go to Him, seeking His grace for Jesus' sake.

Silence for reflection on the Word of God and our sinful condition

- P Father in heaven,
- C we confess that although You have declared us to be Your set-apart, holy people, too often we resemble the world around us in our speaking and acting. Instead of letting Your will be done as Your humble servants, we follow our own paths. We cannot serve You in holiness and righteousness without Your aid. As You have ransomed us not with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, so now assure us of Your forgiveness and move our feet to walk in paths pleasing to You for the sake of Your holy Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ.
- P Do not be afraid! You have found favor with God. Our heavenly Father sent His Son to enter human history to be born of a virgin and live the obedient life for you. God raised Him from the dead and gave Him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God (1 Peter 1:21). Because God declares you to be holy, you are free from sin to serve Him in joy. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

PSALM Psalm 99

- P The LORD reigns; let the peoples tremble!

 He sits enthroned upon the cherubim; let the earth quake!
- A The LORD is great in Zion; He is exalted over all the peoples.
- C Let them praise Your great and awesome name! Holy is He!
- P The King in His might loves justice. You have established equity;
- A You have executed justice and righteousness in Jacob.
- C Exalt the LORD our God; worship at His footstool! Holy is He!
- P Moses and Aaron were among His priests,
- A Samuel also was among those who called upon His name.
- P They called to the LORD, and He answered them. In the pillar of the cloud He spoke to them;
- A they kept His testimonies and the statute that He gave them.

FIRST READING Judges 13:2–7

(The angel of the Lord announces Samson's coming birth: "He shall begin to save Israel." Samson foreshadows Jesus' work.)

- L The First Reading is from the thirteenth chapter of Judges.
 - There was a certain man of Zorah, of the tribe of the Danites, whose name was Manoah. And his wife was barren and had no children. And the angel of the LORD appeared to the woman and said to her,
- C "Behold, you are barren and have not borne children, but you shall conceive and bear a son.
- L Therefore be careful and drink no wine or strong drink, and eat nothing unclean, for behold, you shall conceive and bear a son. No razor shall come upon his head, for the child shall be a Nazirite to God from the womb,
- C and he shall begin to save Israel from the hand of the Philistines."
- L Then the woman came and told her husband, "A man of God came to me, and his appearance was like the appearance of the angel of God, very awesome. I did not ask him where he was from, and he did not tell me his name, but he said to me, 'Behold, you shall conceive and bear a son. So then drink no wine or strong drink, and eat nothing unclean, for the child shall be a Nazirite to God from the womb to the day of his death."
- L This is the Word of the Lord.
- C. Thanks be to God.

SECOND READING 1 Peter 1:13–21

(We are holy because we have been given Jesus' holiness by grace.)

- L The Second Reading is from the first chapter of First Peter.
 - Therefore, preparing your minds for action, and being sober-minded, set your hope fully on the grace that will be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ. As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance,
 - C but as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, since it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy."
 - L And if you call on Him as Father who judges impartially according to each one's deeds, conduct yourselves with fear throughout the time of your exile, knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot. He was foreknown before the foundation of the world but was made manifest in the last times for the sake of you who through Him are believers in God, who raised Him from the dead and gave Him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God.

- L This is the Word of the Lord.
- C Thanks be to God.

THIRD READING Luke 1:26–38

(The angel Gabriel announces Jesus' coming birth to Mary. He shall be the Son of the Most High.)

L The Third Reading is from the first chapter of Luke.

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said,

- C "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!"
- L But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her,
- C "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God.
- L And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call His name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to Him the throne of His father David, and He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom there will be no end."

And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?" And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God. And behold, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. For nothing will be impossible with God." And Mary said,

- C "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word."
- L And the angel departed from her.
- L This is the Word of the Lord.
- C Thanks be to God.



- C Amen.


PRAYER FOR PEACE


- P O God, from whom come all holy desires, all good counsels, and all just works,
